

SIASCONSET CHAPEL OUTREACH - 2022

There are so many wonderful aspects to being a member of the Siasconset Union Chapel community. Certainly, near the top of the list is knowing that, through the generosity of so many parishioners, the Chapel is giving more than ever to those in need on our very special island through its outreach program. In fact, the Chapel is likely the fourth or fifth largest donor to the Nantucket community.

The mission of the Chapel's Outreach Committee is to provide support for "health and human services on Nantucket and beyond." Lately, the needs have been so great locally that we have not looked beyond; although in the past, we have donated to such humanitarian groups as World Central Kitchen. However, increasing inflation, the scarcity of affordable housing for islanders, and the ongoing ripple effects of the pandemic that disrupted so many livelihoods have focused our attention on island non-profits.

In 2022, we funded 19 island non-profits, providing money for housing, fuel and food assistance, professional support for teachers, scholarships for small learners, travel monies for health reasons, helping homeless and immigration resource centers, safety from abuse, and after-school resources for teenagers. We are so proud of the work they do: A Safe Place, Boston Med Flight, Community School Summer Boost Program, David Glidden Travel Fund, Fairwinds, Habitat for Humanity, Immigration Resource Center, Marla Lamb Travel Fund, Nantucket Boys and Girls Club, Nantucket Food Fuel and Rental Assistance, Nantucket Star, Nantucket Warming Place, Our House, Palliative & Supportive Care of Nantucket Foundation, St. Paul's Laundry Love, St. Paul's Meals Mission, Rising Tide Preschool, Small Friends, and The Community Foundation – The Nantucket Fund.

And, they let us know what it means to them: "Your donation is a burst of hope for our community members that are experiencing insecurity." "Our teams would not have the resources to provide expert, efficient and compassionate critical care medical transport without thoughtful donors like you." "Your generous donation... enables the unsheltered to stay in a hotel when the weather is 32F or below." "Your recent donation guarantees that we are able to continue to provide trauma informed care in the aftermath of abuse as well as prevention programs to try to eliminate future

abuse from occurring." "I would like to extend our heartfelt thanks for your generous donation towards our work supporting the special needs population on Nantucket." "We have noted that your donation is for tuition assistance for our families who need this extra help." "Your thoughtful and generous donation will support Nantucket high school youth after-school." 'Your donation helps us to provide evidence-based professional mental health counseling...and other critical programs to our island community, regardless of ability to pay or insurance status." "Please extend our sincere thanks to the entire Chapel Board for their confidence in us."

Funds for Outreach come from collections on two summer Outreach Sundays – one in July and the other in August. Last summer, we also raised money with our third annual Lobster Lalapalooza and a raffle of another beautiful needlepoint rug. This year, we have a few other fundraising ideas in mind; so stay tuned.

The bottom line is that we could not begin to help our valued neighbors and this special island community without your support and commitment. We look forward to reuniting with you and celebrating another summer with our beloved Chapel community.

INVESTMENT AND FINANCIAL REPORT

Looking back on 2022 and at the first three months of 2023, Siasconset Union Chapel continues to be blessed from a financial perspective. This is thanks to the ongoing wonderful generosity of our congregation.

In 2022 income from all sources other than withdrawals from our endowment was \$280,000. This includes annual appeal, Sunday Plate, weddings and events. Expenses other than outreach and capital items were \$269,000 so completely covered by donations and other income. The cost of capital items, the painting of the interior of the chapel at \$91,000 was covered by withdrawals from our endowment. This is our usual practice for capital improvement expenses. Outreach grants and expenses of \$155,000 were covered by a combination of \$30,000 withdrawal from our endowment and a planned drawdown of our cash balance at the bank.

Our budget for 2023, approved by the Board on February 24, continues our outreach grants at \$150,000 as in 2022 and 2021. As in the last two years this level of grants is dependent on the continued generosity of our congregation backed up by access to our endowment funds.

On the income and expense side it is a conservative and risk adverse budget. We have budgeted lower levels of contributions from the Sunday plate as well as the Annual Appeal given the uncertainty surrounding the economy in 2023. On the expense side we are budgeting only \$20,000 in capital expenditures vs the \$91,000 we spent in 2022 to paint the interior of the Chapel. We have increased compensation dollars by 10% to reflect the cost of living in Nantucket.

If, as we have budgeted, our income levels fall below last years, we plan to access our endowment to the extent necessary to help fund both the lower level of capital expenditures as well as the third year of \$150,000 in outreach grants. Elsewhere in this letter the importance of this level of community support will be described in the Outreach Committee's report.

We want to remind you that if you are making changes to your estate plans this year, a bequest to the Chapel Endowment would be much appreciated. We also hope the wonderfully generous support to the Sunday plates and the Annual Appeal will be continued in 2023.


WEDDINGS

THE PET COLUMBARIUM THE COLUMBARIUM

The Chapel garden includes a small columbarium in the west garden where pet ashes may be scattered. There is a \$150 fee and a memory log is kept in the Chapel.

The columbarium is a beautiful and peaceful final resting place for Chapel worshipers and Sconset residents-summer guests and year round.

The current cost to reserve a half niche is \$3,000.[per person] and \$6,000. For a full niche for two people. An additional interment fee, which cannot be prepaid, includes a Chapel Issued urn, a plaque and opening/resealing of the niche at the time of interment. Please see website for more details on how to apply.

There is another option of direct in-ground Interment of ashes. A granite stele wall "niche" can be reserved for \$500. The stele wall located in the west garden, will have a plaque and the ashes will be interred in a designated location on the grounds.

Interments currently cost \$1,000.
